TRANSMISSION ACCESS POLICY STUDY GROUP'S MOTION TO INTERVENE AND COMMENTS IN SUPPORT

Pursuant to the Commission's December 16, 2008 Notice of Filing, and Rules 212 and 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. § 385.212 and .214, the Transmission Access Policy Study Group ("TAPS") seeks intervention in the above-captioned proceedings, and expresses its support of the decision of the North American Electric Reliability Corporation ("NERC"), as reflected in its December 15, 2008 Compliance Filing in Response to October 16, 2008 Order on 2009 Business Plans and Budgets, ¹ to eliminate the Reliability Readiness Evaluation and Improvement Program in light of other programs to develop and enforce reliability standards and to improve reliability.

I. MOTION TO INTERVENE

TAPS is an informal association of transmission-dependent utilities in more than 30 states, promoting open and non-discriminatory transmission access.² As transmission-

dependent utilities, TAPS members have long recognized the importance of grid reliability. Many TAPS members participate in the development of and are subject to NERC Reliability Standards. As load serving entities, TAPS members bear their share of the cost of the NERC budget.

TAPS is therefore directly affected by the instant filing. Its interests cannot adequately be represented by any other party, and its participation in this proceeding is in the public interest. TAPS should therefore be granted intervention to enable it to participate as a full party in this proceeding.

On November 17, 2008, TAPS filed a motion to intervene out of time in Docket Nos. RR08-6-000, RR07-14-001 (along with a request for clarification or rehearing of the Commission's October 16 Order). Because the Commission has not yet acted on that motion, TAPS seeks intervention in the above-captioned proceedings through the instant motion.

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II. COMMENTS

TAPS submits this filing to support NERC's determination (discussed at pages 18-34 of its December 15 Compliance Filing) to eliminate the Reliability Readiness

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Evaluation and Improvement Program ("Readiness Program"). TAPS recognizes the

importance of improving reliability and appreciates the Commission's desire to foster

programs that do so. However, TAPS agrees with NERC's assessment that the Readiness

Program has outlived its usefulness and is no longer cost effective, and its findings that

improvement in reliability could better be achieved through directing NERC resources

towards improving and enforcing standards coupled with other reliability improvement

measures (see NERC's December 16 Compliance Filing at 33-34). NERC's decision to

eliminate the Readiness Program was fully vetted and supported by NERC stakeholders,

including the NERC Operating Committee. NERC's well-justified decision bears the

hallmarks of prudent management: resources should not be continue to be expended on

programs that have become redundant and that no longer deliver reliability-enhancement

value to the consumers that bear their cost.
